
## Summary

- •Objective: To understand the actual situation under the Covid pandemic, which will help us provide better support in the future.
- •Period: I<sup>st</sup> June to I<sup>st</sup> July, 2021
- •Subjects: 36 grassroots organizations that have received the JWF's support for activities since 2016.
- •Respondents: 28 organizations
- •Response rate: 77%

Q1. Have the beneficiaries of your project which we had supported negatively affected by the COIVD-19? Respondents: 28




**89%** of project areas, which are mainly rural, have been negatively affected by COVID-19.

If yes in Q1, what kind of effects have been there?




### Economic and educational impacts are the most common

Q2. Compared to the surrounding areas, how much have they affected? Respondents: 28




About half of the project sites have been affected to the same degree as the surrounding areas.

### Almost all of the organizations

responded that the project implementation of the projects had contributed to or would contribute to mitigation of the negative impacts of COVID-19. **WASH** was the most frequently cited factor:

- Availability of a safe and stable water supply.
- Availability of hand washing facilities.
- Understanding of the importance of water, hygiene, and health, including hand washing. (Awarenessraising activities, hand-washing classes, etc. were conducted.)

Key factors for promoting hand washing

# 3–1. Contribution to the reduction of negative impact of COVID–19

#### Economic

- Farmers have started growing vegetables and are now able to sell the surplus they don't consume themselves. (Agriculture)
- Women who lost their livelihoods during the pandemic are able to earn something by working as water delivery assistants. (Drinking water)

#### Educational

- Beneficiaries have access to hygienic latrines and hand washing facilities in schools. (Construction of toilets and hand washing facilities)
- Increased health education for prevention and behavior change against COVID 19 and management of WASH issues in schools, households and communities. (Construction of toilets)
