1.1 Kyoto World Water Grand Prize

The Kyoto World Water Grand Prize ("the Grand Prize") is the prestige international award that recognizes outstanding grass-roots organizations addressing water issues in developing countries. This Grand Prize was established in 2003 by the City of Kyoto and the World Water Council in commemoration of the 3rd World Water Forum held in the Lake Biwa and Yodo River Basin including Kyoto, Japan. Since then, the Grand Prize has been awarded at the time of the World Water Forum that is convened every three years.

1.2 Kyoto World Water Grand Prize 2022

The co-organizers called for applications for the Kyoto World Water Grand Prize 2022 to recognize outstanding projects implemented in the past and their achievements and impacts.


The criteria of the 2022 edition of the Grand Prize highlighted Kyoto's resilience and its long history of development where people pursued creativity through cultural exchange and at the same time valued harmony between tradition and innovation, and the idea that activities harmonized with unique social and cultural dimensions in the project area would ultimately lead to sustainable development. In this context, it aimed to honor a distinguished organization involved in grass-roots activities in developing countries, make the importance of grass-roots activities known throughout the world, and contribute to improving the quality of such activities.

Calling for applications and communication

In April 2021, two PR videos were newly created and released. The open call for applications was communicated using these videos via the websites of each co-organizer and social media. As a result, 50 applications were received from 23 countries.

Screening and final selection

In line with Kyoto's culture of harmony between tradition and innovation, the screening focused on contributions to the development of culture and community as well as sustainability of the activities. After a rigorous screening process by the City of Kyoto, the Japan Water Forum, the Selection Committee chose Pragati, an Indian NGO, as the winner. The project was highly regarded because of its efforts to utilize natural energy for the solution of water issues as well as for the reduction of environmental impacts. The winner was announced on the websites of the co-organizers, in their e-mail newsletters and through other media.

Outline of the screening process

- Call for applications: 7th September, 2020 to 30th April, 2021
- Total number of applications: 50 applications from 23 countries
- Result of the 1st screening: 30 organizations passed.
- Result of the 2nd screening: Three organizations passed.
- Result of the final screening by the Selection Committee: One organization won the Grand Prize.

On 25th March, 2022, the awarding ceremony was held at the closing ceremony of the 9th World Water Forum in Dakar, Senegal.



1.3 Outline of the Winner

Name of the organization; Pragati

PRAGATI is a non-governmental organization established in 1994 and based in South Odisha, India. The organization has a vision "To build a self-help society, free from hunger and exploitation, where everyone irrespective of caste, creed, sex or language have right to dignified means of livelihood and through collective action ensure socio-economic justice and ecological balance". Pragati has a mission "To facilitate and strengthen vibrant people's organizations at different levels of society that will protect, utilize, control and manage local resources and through collective action, ensure dynamic socio-economic change for sustainable development by



advocating for pro-poor governance and bring women, children, tribals and downtrodden, to the mainstream of the society".

2. Outline of the Project by the Award Winner

- Title of the project: Renewable Energy for Crop Production & Safe Drinking Water
- **Project period:** 2012 to 2018
- Project area: Koraput District, Odisha State, India
- Number of direct beneficiaries: 1,081 households (1,122 male, 1,176 female and 1,907 children)

Objectives and outcomes of the project:

- · Aiming at promoting enhance income of small and marginal farmers, solar irrigation systems were installed. As the result, individual and community owned solar pumps established in 23 villages benefitted 158 farmers growing vegetables and food crops in 86 hectares of land throughout the year, earning an average of Rs100,000- to 250,000- per annum. It has substantially reduced expenses on use of diesel powered pumps and contributes significantly to reduction in emission of Green House Gases.
- Aiming at ensuring safe drinking water for rural poor to reduce their vulnerabilities to water borne diseases, solar powered filtration systems were installed. As the result, 923 households in 21 villages have access to safe drinking water through installation of solar powered filtration systems which has reduced water borne diseases and drudgery of women in fetching water.
