4. Training and installation of rainwater harvesting containers for girls, Uganda

- Organization: SORAK DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (#002)
- Country/Area: Lusalira Trading centre, Mubende District, Uganda
- Budget: USD 1,738 (JWF Fund: USD 1,500, contribution from SORAK DEVELOPMENT AGENCY: USD 138 and beneficiaries: USD 100)
- Direct beneficiaries: 5,000 people (Men: 1,000, Women: 1,000 and Children: 3,000)
- Background: Rural Ugandans are disproportionately vulnerable to water-borne diseases through unsafe water, limited sanitation capacity, and poor hand-washing habits. Most of them do not have even basic access to water, sanitation, or hand-washing facilities with soap. Amidst the challenges of lockdown, and the lack of water and sanitizers, children continue to travel long distances in search of water.

- Main activities of the project: Identifying 20 vulnerable girls and conducting two days of training for the girls in WASH entrepreneurship and onsite construction of water harvesting containers (500L); installing a rainwater harvesting system for ten households; conducting a five-day community campaign with a truck for promoting the project and the importance of hand-washing with soap; and water quality testing
- Sustainability activities: The girls acquire manufacturing and business skills regarding rainwater harvesting containers.
