- Organization: Water With Development (WaterWide) (#086)
- Country/Area: Kaida village, Abuja, Nigeria
- Budget: USD 2,371 (JWF Fund: USD 1,500 and contribution from WaterWide: USD 871)
- Direct beneficiaries: 2,300 people (men: 500, women: 800 children: 1,000)
- Background:

Kaida, like every other rural community in Nigeria, is characterized by a wide spectrum of underdevelopment in possibly every sector, from WASH, to health, to education. There are several boreholes in the community but none of them are functioning. Residents must resort to fetching water. Women have to wake up early every day and gather at a pond to fetch water, and because the pond does not provide enough water, they have to wait hours for the water to rise again before they can obtain any. At the school, the children have to return home to get drinking water because the school has no functioning water source.

- Main activities of the project: Meeting with community stakeholders; rehabilitating three water boreholes; two sensitization on best WASH practices; training on borehole usage; training those responsible for operation and maintenance; establishing a monitoring team; and water quality testing
- Sustainability activities: The monitoring team collects users' fee and manage the boreholes.
