## I. Rehabilitation of wells in Kanjuki village, Uganda

- Background:

Residents of the economically deprived rural district of Kayunga have been navigating the COVID-19 pandemic with the added challenge of living without access to safe water and hygiene. Water is chronically scarce and is growing more so due to broken or non-functioning wells and a growing population. Despite evidence of corrosion in the hand-pumps for many years, it remains a problem. Communities are left without clean water and have to travel far for this basic necessity. Families are forced to use unsafe sources or walk long distances for water, a major cause of absenteeism among learners. Children are abducted and sacrificed when searching for water in swampy, forested and overgrown areas. Women must walk long distances or use unsafe water sources because their local source doesn't function for days, months, or even years.

- Main activities of the project:
  - Holding three community meetings for sensitization and to raise awareness of the project and COVID-19; repairing three hand-pumps and maintaining their surroundings; conducting water quality testing; and providing three days of on-the-job training for six repair personnel
- Sustainability activities:
  - Conducting two days of training for six hygiene promoters and three days of training and capacity building for three water user committees; and gaining technical support from the local government
