

## 5. Rehabilitation of wells in Chipaka village (Tanzania)

- (1) Local partner: WANAWAKE PAMBANO GROUP (#242)  
Funded in November, 2021. A women-led group involved in activities incorporating micro-financing.
- (2) Budget for the project: \$2,200  
(Breakdown: JWF Fund: \$1,500, implementing org: \$200, beneficiaries: \$200, other donor :\$300)
- (3) Number of beneficiaries: 650 people
- (4) Background:
  - ① Target area was subject to shortages of safe, clean water. Women in particular were living in hard circumstances because they had to use unsafe wells or wait for long periods to collect water.
  - ② These water-related challenges were making the lives of people already facing economic hardship even worse.
  - ③ Fetching water is regarded as the work of women and children, so they were under a heavy burden and faced great risks.

Establishment of a committee dealing with the safe use of water; installation of a solar-powered pump and storage tank; training for volunteers.
