4. Improvement of water supply systems in Mikindani village (Kenya)

(1) Local partner: Star Awake CBO (#059)

Founded I March, 2011. A group involved in activities aimed at supplying safe water to villagers

- (2) Budget for the project: \$1,808 (Breakdown of funds: JWF FUND: \$1,500, beneficiaries, \$308)
- (3) Number of beneficiaries: 450 people
- (4) Current situation:
 - a. One clinic in the targeted area was forced to close under COVID-19 regulations because it couldn't secure enough safe water.
 - b. The villagers depend on a water source located in a field near the village for domestic use. As the water is heavily contaminated, the villagers face the risk of water-borne diseases.
 - c. There is no choice but to buy expensive water obtained from far-away water pipes in order to ensure a safe supply. As a result, the villagers are trapped further in financial difficulties.
