3. Access to clean water for quality education in Kayunga, Uganda

- Local partner: Rural Initiative for Development and Empowerment (RIDE-UGANDA) (#184)
 RIDE-UGANDA was established in 2014 in Kayunga District, Uganda with the mission of creating
 innovative solutions to meet community challenges and build strong, equitable and sustainable
 communities. RIDE-UGANDA has implemented over 44 shallow well projects in rural communities,
 providing clean water access to thousands. It is a JWF Fund 2021 recipient.
- Project budget: \$1,816 (JWF Fund: \$1,500, implementing organization: \$200, beneficiaries: \$116)
- Project expenditure: \$1,818 (JWF Fund: \$1,500, implementing organization: \$218, beneficiaries: \$100, 100% of budget)
- Number of beneficiaries: 650 (100 men, 150 women, 400 children)
- Background:

Kayunga Junior School, with 300 kindergarten and primary school children coming from poor families in Kisawo Village and surrounding areas, was facing a water challenge. A lack of access to clean water had led to high student absenteeism due to water-borne diseases, poor sanitation and hygiene practices, as well as high staff turnover, contributing to poor academic performance. Children were being taken out of classes to assist with water collection both at school and home for at least five hours a day and were unable to complete their primary education.

 - Three community sessions in Kayunga Junior school to raise awareness of the project
 - Digging, developing and constructing one shallow well
 - Installation of a hand pump and construction of a 16-tap hand washing facility with a submersible pump
 - On-the-job training for three community hand pump repairers
 - Training and capacity-building of a Water Users' Committee
