Overview

In 2001, Jack Sim saw that 40% of the world's population did not have access to proper sanitation. He created the World Toilet Organization to put Sanitation on media center-stage, using his unique blend humour and serious facts. This created a global movement mobilising politicians, policy makers, academia, NGOs and all stakeholders to focus on solving the sanitation crisis.

In 2013, WTO's founding day 19 Nov was unanimously approved by all 193 countries of the UN General Assembly as the official UN World Toilet Day.

In the last 24 years, 2.5 billion people has access to proper sanitation.

Mr. Jack Sim will describe how to use the Leverage Model you can create massive global impact without authority, permission, power or money. You will learn how to create and orchestrate diverse stakeholders into an efficiently aligned and highly motivated ecosystem that delivers the impact in their own name.

After his keynote presentation, we will hold a panel discussion with experts and practitioners from ADB, Sato LIXIL, and Water.org.

Prof Dr. Jack Sim, Founder & Director, World Toilet Organization

Jack Sim is the founder of the Restroom Association of Singapore, the World Toilet Organization, the World Toilet Day initiative and Bottom of the Pyramid (BoP) Hub. Formerly from the construction industry, he decided to devote the rest of his life to social work after attaining financial independence at the age of 40.

In 2001, for "creating goodwill and bringing the subject into the open" and "mobilizing national support in providing on-the-ground expertise" he received the Schwab Foundation award for Social Entrepreneur of the Year. In 2007, Jack was elected a Fellow of Ashoka: Innovators for the Public, and also became one of the key members to convene the Sustainable Sanitation Alliance which is composed of key players in the sanitation space.

Jack was named one of the Heroes of the Environment for 2008 by Time magazine. He also founded the BOP HUB and a series of social businesses and startups. He is now constructing a 65,000 sq ft World Trade Center for the Poor in Singapore to coordinate an effort to transform the 4 billion poor into a massively efficient marketplace to end global poverty.

Pierre is the Manager of International Affairs at the Japan Sanitation Consortium (JSC), the Asia-Pacific Water Forum's Knowledge Hub for sanitation.

He has 20 years of experience in sanitation, with particular focus on fecal sludge management. Since joining JSC in 2009, he has been involved in sanitation projects in Asian countries such Viet Nam, Malaysia, Bhutan and India. He is the coauthor of 'Sanitation and Sustainable Development in Japan' (ADB 2016) and 'Accountability Mechanisms for Inclusive City-Level Public Services in Asia' (ADBI 2023).

Since 2015, he has been involved in a number of Working Groups of ISO/TC 224 as an expert representing Japan for the development of several international standards.

Pierre holds a doctoral degree in regional development studies. He is a visiting researcher and lecturer at Toyo University in Japan.
