


The first webinar will feature an overview of water issues in Japan.

Born in 1945 in Kanagawa Prefecture and Ph.D. in River Engineering. Upon completing his master's degree in Civil Engineering at Tohoku University, he started his career at the Ministry of Construction in 1970.

After successful career of developing and constructing river and dam facilities, he retired in 2002 as Director General for River Bureau, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism. From 2006 on, he has been serving as Chair and Secretary General of Japan Water Forum.

He published several books including, among others, "Clarifying the Mystery of Japanese Civilization"(SEIRYU Publishing Co., Ltd, 2003) and "Hydro Energy Saves Japan" (Toyo Keizai Inc.).
